



Assessment of INAF Financial Status

- The INAF accounts generated about \$103,600 in income and capital gain. The INAF spending limit of 4.5% (\$90,000) is within the earnings.
- The initial seed fund of INAF was ~\$1.94M starting on 1/1/2015. Currently (9/30/2019) it is ~\$2.08M, after we have spent ~\$310,000.
- The financial status of INAF is sound.
- The fund is now expected to generate ~\$71,000 cash for the next year. This will reduce the capital draw to ~\$21,500.
- For next year, the spending is pegged at 4.5% of the 3-year running average of INAF assets; or \$92,510.

Summary of 2018-2019 Activities

- The main activity in this period was that of the National Go Center in Washington, DC. NGC has regularly updated its activity in quarterly reports.
- NGC has now attained its tax-exempt 501c(3) status. This should help its fund-raising activities. NGC will also launch a paid membership program next year.
- INAF co-sponsored the second Nihon Kiin Workshop for Go Teachers in 10/2018 at Nihon Kiin. Teachers from US, Cuba, and Mexico participated.
- INAF sponsored two Nihon-Kiin professionals to visit the 2019
 US Go Congress and conducted a teachers' workshop, which
 was well-received by all participants.

Plans for the Next Fiscal Year

- In 2019-2020, it is proposed to support the NGC with \$50,000.
- It is proposed to partially sponsor the NAGF's (North American Go Federation's) inaugural pro qualification tournament for two years at \$10,000 per year.
- It is proposed to sponsor AGA to build an archive for historical documents, including the records of early exchange between Nihon Kiin professionals and AGA members.
- It is proposed to sponsor two specific Nihon Kiin outbound projects at \$15,000, according to the budget proposed.
- There is an unspecified balance in the spending budget of ~\$5,000 that can be flexibly directed to other projects.

Details of the North American Pro Qualification

- The tournament was previously organized by AGA. Held in 2012-2015, the event produced five professionals from US and Canada.
- From 2020, the tournament will be run by NAGF and will be open to all North American citizens.
- In July of 2020 and 2021, the event will be held at NGC and SGC (Seattle).
- The number of pros to be promoted will depend on the strength of the field.
- In parallel, a pro rank promotion system will be implemented.

Details of the AGA Archive Project

- It is proposed to rebuild, update, and digitize the historical documents of AGA, including early interactions with international partners.
- A budget of \$7,000 is requested (1) to sponsor an intern to process and arrange the collections, publish it finding aids, and digitize; (2) to replace aging storage container; and (3) to acquire a new scanner.
- The person in charge of the project is Karoline Li, the AGA archivist.
