



Assessment of INAF Financial Status

- For the 2023-24 fiscal year, the INAF accounts gained \$486,713 before spending, which represents a ~22% increase. The 2023-24 INAF spending budget was (\$99,000); actual spending was \$103,875, mainly due to the special grant to the Canadian Go Association for organizing the 2025 World Amateur Go Championship.
- The initial INAF fund was ~\$1.94M on 1/1/2015. As of 9/30/2024, it is ~\$**2.46M**. This suggests spending 4.5% of the 3-year running average balance has been a sound strategy.
- For 2024-25, the spending budget is set at \$120,500. The usual 4.5% budget would be \$99,746, but we have brought forward an additional \$20,000 from the previous year (\$15,000 for the Canadian Go Association and \$5,000 for Nihon Kiin).

Prognosticating 2025

- Overall, our JPMorgan investment strategy seems to be sound. Our fund has grown substantially in the last 12 months thanks to favorable market performance in the US.
- We see no reason to change the current asset allocation (54/44/1 equities/bonds/cash), which aims
 for modest long-term growth of capital with acceptable short-term volatility.
- Current short-term bond yields are around ~4%. The stock market is predicted to be volatile due to global conflicts. Also, the US presidential election may influence the market. However, our portfolio allocation is designed to be robust against moderate volatility.
- Based on the predictions above, we expect the INAF portfolio to increase by about 5% over the next year.

Summary of 2023-24 Activities

- The National Go Center continues to play a central role for promoting Go in the US. (more details in Attachment 1)
- The Canadian Go Association is on track to host the 2025 World Amateur Go Championship (more details in Attachment 2)
- The INAF Lifetime Achievement Award was given to Sam Zimmerman for his critical contribution to the AGA database and the US Go Congress software.
- The NAGF successfully organized the 2024 Pro Qualification Tournament in Canada.
- Professor Xiuwen Wu's team at the National Louis University has been given an extension until April 2025 for the review of the Relationship Between Mind Sports and Cognitive Functions.
- Nihon Kiin project was forwarded to the next year for the support of 2025 WAGC in Canada.

INAF Lifetime Achievement Award

- Sam Zimmerman was awarded the 2024 INAF Lifetime Achievement Award for his long time contribution to the North American Go Community.
- He was unable to travel to the US Go Congress received the award by mail.





2024 Pro Qualification Tournament

- The tournament was successfully completed in Montreal, Canada, from June 16 to 21.
- A total of 12 players participated (5 US, 7 Canada)
- Bill Lin from Canada became the newest NAGF pro.
- Live-broadcasted by the AGA EJ team and Leago.

- The National Go Center will lead important Go activities for the North American Go.
- The INAF Lifetime Achievement Award will be given in May 2025.
- The NAGF will continue to organize annual pro qualification tournaments.
- The INAF will support the CGA to organize the 2025 World Amateur Go Championship. Special grant of \$30,000 has been awarded already, and additional \$30,000 will be given to the organizing team in 2025.
- Nihon Kiin Project will be allocated \$10,000, including \$5,000 forwarded from previous year.

Next Board Meeting

- The regular annual meeting should be held in October-November 2025.
- In addition, an in-person meeting at the 2025 World Amateur Go Championship in Canada can be considered.
